Pick-Up Air Mail Starting Aug. 12

Pittsburgh to Huntington Route One of Three To Get Service

WASHINGTON, Aug. 2.—(AP)—Pick-up and delivery air mail service will be inaugurated Aug. 12 on three routes between Pittsburgh and Huntington, W. Va.; Pittsburgh and Philadelphia, and Pittsburgh and Jamestown, N. Y., the post office department announced tonight.

The announcement did not include dates for inauguration of service on two other routes recently authorized by the Civil Aeronautics board. These routes are between Pittsburgh and Huntington, via the Ohio valley, and Pittsburgh and Williamsport, Pa.

All-American Aviation, Inc., of Wilmington, Del., will operate the service.

All-American Aviation operated on experimental basis on routes between Pittsburgh and Philadelphia and Pittsburgh and Huntington for a year, but this service ended last May when congressional authorization for it expired. Congress then gave the Civil Aeronautics board power to authorize the service on a permanent basis.

Intermediate points to be served on the Pittsburgh to Huntington route include: Morgantown, W. Va., Fairmont, W. Va., Clarksburg, W. Va., Grafton, W. Va., Philippi, W. Va., (x) Belington, W. Va., Elkins, W. Va., Buckhannon, W. Va., Weston, W. Va., Glenville, W. Va., Grantsville, W. Va., Spencer, W. Va., Charleston, W. Va., (So. Charleston, St. Albans, Nitro, Dunbar, W. Va.), Hurricane, W. Va., and Milton, W. Va. (Barboursville, W. Va.)

(x) Service will be inaugurated as soon as pick-up station is completed. Towns in parentheses will receive service from nearest point on route.
