St. Albans Residents Seek Work on Bridge

A number of St. Albans residents have registered with the federal re-employment service for work on the new bridge over the Kanawha river there when its construction begins. Between 50 and 75 skilled and unskilled workers will be employed on the project, which has been authorized under the civil works administration. The workers for the most part will be residents of St. Albans.

A decision to assign three or four additional investigators to facilitate the distribution of food products to needy families in the county was reached Thursday at a meeting of the commodity committee of the CWA. A carload of pork and 17,500 pounds of beans have arrived and will be distributed.
