

Toll Bridge Robbery Brings 5-Year Term

The theft of \$24 in St. Albans bridge toll money in December of last year yesterday brought Moses Johnson, 28, Negro, of Huntington, a five-year state penitentiary term. Johnson pleaded guilty in intermediate court to unarmed robbery of \$24 from W. L. Lynch, toll collector.

Denver Arthur Batten, 23, of Barberton, O., confessed to theft of the automobile of W. M. Thomas of Charleston and was fined \$200 and sentenced to two to 10 years in the penitentiary.

Two Negroes of Wilson hollow were placed on probation a year. They were Louise McSwain, charged with unlawful wounding of Vonetta Fields, and Leonard Field, charged with unlawful wounding of Louise McSwain.
